Call to Order

VOA President Mike Kuchavik welcomed attendees and began the meeting at 9:05pm EST.

Meeting Details

Topic: Goal for the Meeting

Kuchavik presented the agenda for the meeting:

Vote on membership options for 2023 that have been discussed over the last few months and circulated via email.

Topic: Membership Options

Kuchavik – I hope that you all had a chance to further review the options I have emailed out. Do we have questions on those?

Question - Rose Klutz

For option 1, what's the reason for giving back \$10 to the regions?

Kuchavik – It's a move in the direction of getting to 50/50 split on regional contributions. We have run the budgets based on realistic estimates and facts and concluded that we can afford that additional spend.

Klutz – If you didn't give back that additional money would it help avoid a negative cash position?

Kuchavik – Wes and Matt have run the numbers and have said that we'll be fine at that rate, understanding that the estimates don't include any additional revenue from advertisers or others.

Question - Rose Klutz

For option 2, would that create a lot of additional work for someone to figure it all out?

Wes Frasard – yes, but I'm not concerned about the amount of work. It's hard to know how to budget estimated levels for who wants the magazine in virtual/print or who doesn't at all without having more polling or surveys done this year. The best we could do in budgeting is guess, which is the only real drawback.

Comment – Jim Johnson

In the case of the a la carte, a major drawback for us planning NVE5 in Colorado is the unknown number of magazine subscribers would make selling advertising tricky, because advertisers would like to know how many impressions they're going to get before buying in.

VOTE: Are we ready to vote on membership structure options One and Two as presented?
